Together, we are bringing care and hope to our neighbors who are suffering: widows, children in poverty, and people without homes. Every day, I get to see the good things God is doing among us, and want to share a glimpse of them with you!



The Timothy House

In 2012, we provided a home and loving community to 207 men, women and children experiencing homelessness, and were forced to turn away 248 people due to lack of space.



Good Works WALK

Our mission is to creatively inspire and inform participants of all ages about the problems people without homes face, and raise one third of the annual support for the Timothy House.



Nutrition and Health Education

Each year, Good Works provides an estimated 21,000 meals to people in need, and we are working to give our friends greater access to nutritious food and handson health education. Here, a participant in one of our initiatives called "Health for Life" shops at the Athens Farmer's Market.



Friday Night Life

We are celebrating our 20th year of this community experience— offering food, friendship, and opportunities for personal and spiritual growth across the lines of class.
