Because of COVID, we were not able to receive the number of volunteers we had planned on, and the house took much longer and was much more costly than we anticipated. ## FRIDAY NIGHT LIFE 30<sup>TH</sup> BIRTHDAY PARTY

We started Friday Night Life in the kitchen of The Good Works Timothy House in the spring of 1993, because we wanted to stay connected with the residents who were moving out. We had developed a godly affection for many of the people staying with us, and we wanted to find a way to stay in relationships in the hope that we could continue to be present in their lives in some way. I often say, while we welcome people into a temporary home, our vision and hope is to be in relationship with those we are growing to love for much longer than their stay with us. Well... they came and kept coming. We asked our friends at Central UMC if we could meet there, and within a few months 40+ people were coming every Friday Night. We later realized that we were the first weekly public meal in our area. We started with spaghetti, moved to donated pizza, and eventually asked local groups (mostly churches) to sponsor the dinner each week. FNL soon outgrew Central UMC and we took a big step of faith and moved to The Plains UMC in the year 2000. During the winter months we partner with the people of The Plains UMC, and then we move to the Good Works property in the warmer months. This has been our structure for many years. FNL moves back to the GW Property on April 7<sup>th</sup> and we will host the 30th birthday party for FNL on May 19th. Please come! If you'd like to help with this event, please let us know.

#### **SUMMER SERVICE 2023**

We are seeking and welcoming summer interns for another year of Summer Service. This summer we plan to host several week-long Work Retreats, and we are making plans to lead small groups to the homes of those we serve in rural Athens County through Neighbors Helping Neighbors. As we enter the spring and summer of 2023, we are faced with the challenge of our limited capacity to lead those who want to volunteer with us. We are praying for someone who loves God, and joyfully embraces our Vision of HOPE to join us as we provide care and community for our neighbors through 'hands on' service and gardening.
- Country Bed and Breakfast located on the Good Works property continues to provide guests who visit Athens with overnight accommodations at a reasonable price. Revenue from this initiative helps to cover our utility costs.
- WE still have HOPE that someone with a love for gardening, and a love for God, will come and work with us to begin plowing and planting at the **Good Works Garden**; and start gardens at the homes of those we serve through Neighbors Helping Neighbors.
